

Problem Statement and Justification

Agricultural growth is core to fast-tracking economic development in East and Southern Africa. Millions of livelihoods depend on farming at small holder level. However, the full potential of the regions' agricultural sector has not been realized. Although considerable progress has been reported, hunger alerts are still frequent and incomes are low.
